The regular meeting of the Board of Education of Pinconning Area Schools was held virtually via Google Meet on Monday, February 22, 2021. Public viewing was available via YouTube stream. Request for public comment was posted in advance.

President Coutcher called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. President Coutcher led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mike Vieau, Superintendent of Schools discussed; Return to Learn - there has been a decrease in COVID cases and quarantines. Congratulations to Coach Casey Pashak, Varsity Boys Basketball, who are currently 5-0. Saturday, February 20, was great day all around for sports, the Bowling Team defeated Harrison, and the Wrestling Team had two wrestlers, the first in Pinconning history, earn their 100th Victory on the same day.
